

Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Ecuador, the age 65+ population will increase 126% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 24%. For comparison, Ecuador's age 65+ growth rate ranks #52 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 13 in South America.



What is a dependency ratio?

An "old age" dependency ratio is the number of people age 65+ per 100 "working age" people age 20-64. It is therefore intended to measure burden on the working population to provide pensions and support for retirees.

How does Ecuador compare?

The old age dependency ratio in Ecuador is 12.2. This means there are 12.2 people age 65+ per 100 people age 20-64. Based on this ratio, Ecuador ranks #91 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #6 out of 13 in South America, in terms of pressure on working populations to support retirees.



In 2015, the median age in Ecuador was 26.6. The country ranks #116 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #9 out of 13 in South America.


