




Change in Population by Age: 2015-2035

In Malaysia, the age 65+ population will increase 141% between 2015 and 2035 (compared to an 89% increase globally during this period). Meanwhile its total population will increase by just 21%. For comparison, Malaysia's age 65+ growth rate ranks #36 out of 201 nations and territories in the world, and #5 out of 11 in South-Eastern Asia.




